

## **Community Response Fund Grants**

Response funds were used as matching dollars for a fund-raising campaign to secure the funds to build the fire escape. The fire escape was completed so the home could continue to serve unwed mothers and their babies.

A Community Response grant provided the community investmen to secure an Early Head Start Grant for Ellis County.
