In 2007, Community Response Grants ensured the health and safety of our community. Hays High School received a \$650 award to purchase an Automated External school. This AED will allow trained personnel to respond tomedicalemergencies relating to heart failure.

Statistics show that more than 200,000 Americans die of sudden cardia carrest every year. Up to 50,000 of these deaths could have been prevented if someone had initiated the Cardiac Chain of Survival and an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) had been available for immediate use at the time of the emergency.

On any given day as many as 20% of the combined US adult and child population will be in schools. An AED at Hays High School would allow for easy access and response during the school day and during evening activities.

**TheCommunityEmergency** Response Team (CERT) program received a grant of \$13,961.50. This program helps train people to be better prepared to respond to emergency situations in their communities. When emergencies happen, CERT members can give critical support to first responders, provide immediate

volunteers at a disaster site. CERT members can also help grant dollars have helped a new location with greater with non-emergency projects the community.

> CERT is a Citizen Corp program created to harness the power of every individual through education, training and volunteer service to make communities safer, stronger and better prepared to respond to the threats of terrorism, crime, publichealth issues and disaster of all kinds.

In 2007, 42 individuals received CERT training. Grant dollars will allow the CERT team to train additional members, offer specialized training (e.g. ham radio, CPR, traffic control), the CERT team and provide be prepared in a disaster to opportunities. care for themselves, their family and then their community.

The Food for Thought food home with children who are chronically hungry. Started two years ago, this program has now been taken over by Food 4 Kids from the Kansas Food Bank. The program now serves 62 students in every elementary and middle school. Response Grant dollars in 2007 (\$2,700) will provide a light family meal over holidays and breaks and during the summer when Food 4 Kids does not

The Ellis County Ministerial Alliance received a grant of \$5,000 to continue its financial assistance to individuals and families in crisis. The Center for Civic Leadership received a grant of \$200 to support purchase equipment to support the service learning fair which links Fort Hays State educational materials to help University students with local everyindividual and household organizations for volunteer
