Strategic Highlights

2017 was the first year after the allocation process change had been implemented. The United Way and CARE Council application process was transitioned during 2016 to the fall/winter from the spring. This allowed opportunity for the CARE Council to determine agency allocations based on actual money raised/pledged instead of hoping allocations requested would be raised. Additionally, the application process was opened for the first time in many years and the application was provided online. This gave opportunity for a more competitive funding process. Additionally, a community needs assessment was completed.

Financial Highlights

Fiscal year 2016 saw consistency in donations staying the same as in the previous year maintaining for the 2017 allocations. However, campaign 2017 saw a decline of \$20,000 due to continued changes in the economy and employment with an outcome of donations reaching below the targeted goal. Additionally, the United Way updated their reserves policy changing to six months in reserves for both operations and allocations.

Progress Highlights

2017 saw a year of changes. Boardwalk was created in partnership with the Hays Area Chamber of Commerce for all non-profits to have training opportunity for board and administrative development. The Dine-Out Days promotion grew from 4 participating restaurants to 13 with even more anticipated for 2018. The Pumpkin Patch Fun Run/Roll was created as was the Power of the Purse. The Wonder Women League was created from the Power of the Purse event. As of the beginning of 2018, the Wonder Women League has grown in membership and continues growing. They have already identified their first community impact project call the Born Learning Trail in partnership with Adams, Brown, Beran and Ball.

Looking Ahead


The United Way of Ellis County is looking to continue new growth and directions while fostering existing relationships to enhance the community impact model.
